As part of your apprenticeship it is necessary for you to pass end of module exams before you can be entered in to the End Point Assessment (EPA). The exams will directly relate to the training courses you have attended and you will be supplied with access to at least two mock exams; for which you have three attempts, your course workbook (if the course requires this) and an additional study guide.

Course Workbooks & Study Guides

In order to maximize the use of the workbook (where applicable) it is ***essential that you complete this to the best of your ability while on the course***, as this will help form part of your revision.

The workbook should be read and ***understood thoroughly before attempting your first mock exam***; this is because the course you have attended has provided you with knowledge and understanding of the subject areas you will need to answer on the exam.

The workbook should be used in conjunction with the study guide (provided where applicable to the course, if you have not been issued a study guide the workbook contains sufficient information to pass the exam), as the study guide will contain specific information in relation to the exam, however if you don't understand the content in your workbook the study guide will not be as effective.

The study guide should be read and understood before attempting your first mock exam.

Mock Exams

The mock exams you have access to have been created to replicate the real exam as closely as the exam awarding bodies or exam vendors allow.

In most cases you will have access to three mock exams and you will have three attempts at each exam; there are some exams that have a smaller question pool so you will have access to two exams, with three attempts at both of them.

We strongly recommend that you take your time with each exam attempt, read the question and all answers thoroughly and consider the answer before selecting your choice. A good guide to follow is that you should spend *one minute per question*, so a 50 question mock should take around 50 minutes.

To get the best use of the mock exams we have provided we recommend that you follow the below steps:

| i) | Complete mock exam 1 | iv) | Follow the same process if mock 3 is available |
| ii) | Review your answers and do the following:
a. Note the incorrect answers and research these in your workbook and study guide and make notes on why you got the answer wrong and what the correct answer is
b. Note the correct answers and ensure you understand why it was correct, for any answers that you aren't 100% certain why it's correct research them in your workbook and study guide to ensure your understanding for the next mock or real exam | v) | Now you should revise the workbook and study guide further focusing your time and effort on the areas you identified from the wrong answers and right answers you weren't certain on in your first attempts of the mock exams |
| iii) | Then give yourself a day or two and complete mock exam 2 and follow steps a and b in point ii | vi) | Following the further revision in step v) you should have your second attempt at each available mock exam; your score should have improved and you are reaching the pass mark, if not you should be close to it |
| | | vii) | Once again follow the steps in points ii) and v) and take your third attempt at each of the available mock exams |

Remember you need to:

- Understand the content of the workbook and study guides
- Take your time on the mock exams
- Revise your answers where you are uncertain or incorrect



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
